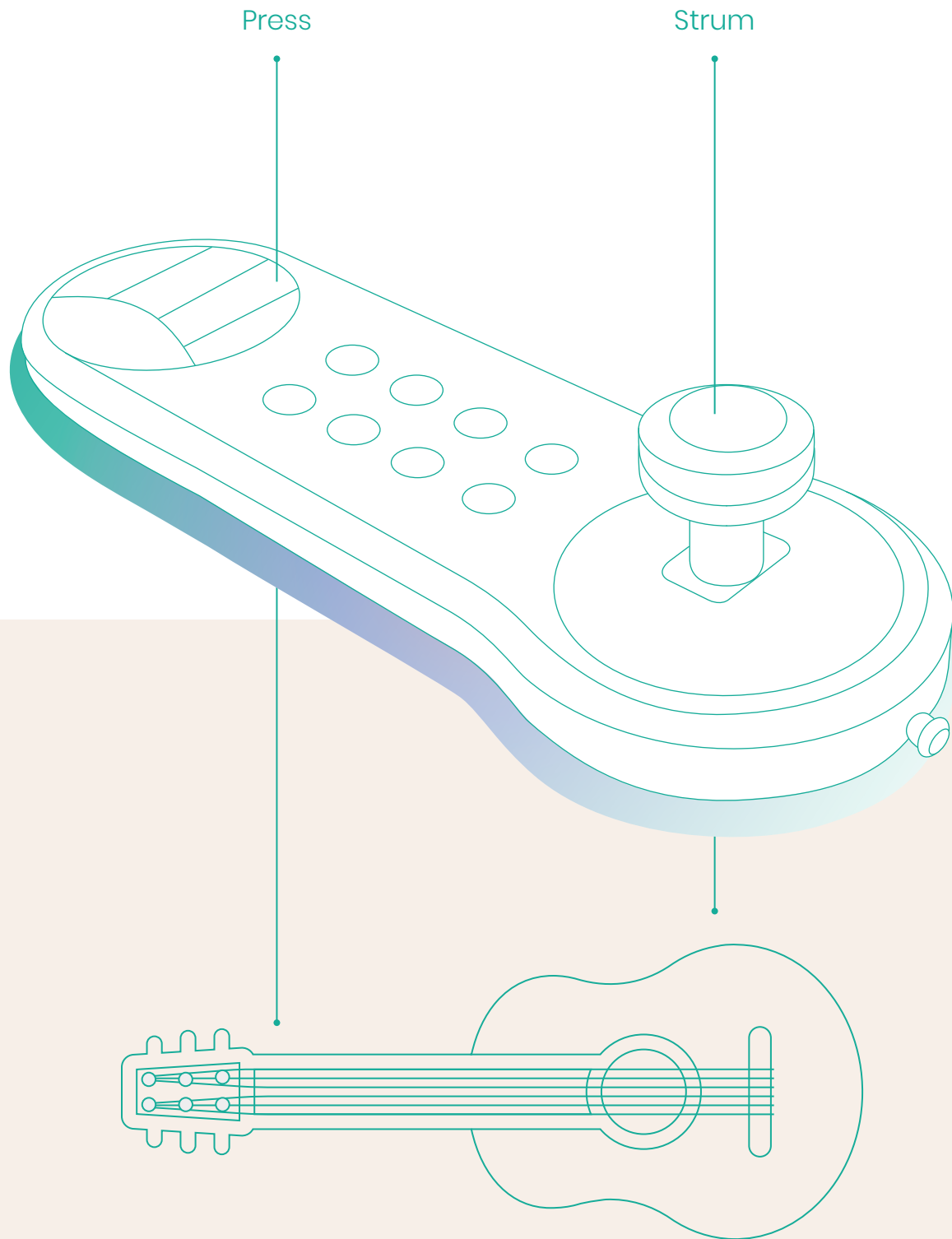

The Arcana Strum – An Inclusive Musical Instrument

The Arcana Strum is the first musical instrument of its kind in the world that is designed to allow people with any type of capability to play and express themselves through music.

The development of this instrument was inspired by the structure of a standard guitar. That, with the help of unique mechanisms, allows users to play in a way that mimics strumming motions, while pressing the chords and notes.

Due to the simplicity of its operation and its musical method which is equivalent to that of a guitar, learning how to use the Arcana Strum is easy and familiar to music teachers, and does not require any special training.

With the Arcana Strum, people of any age and ability can learn in an engaging and equal manner, play in groups and see themselves as active creators, performers and musicians.

* Harmony (music) -

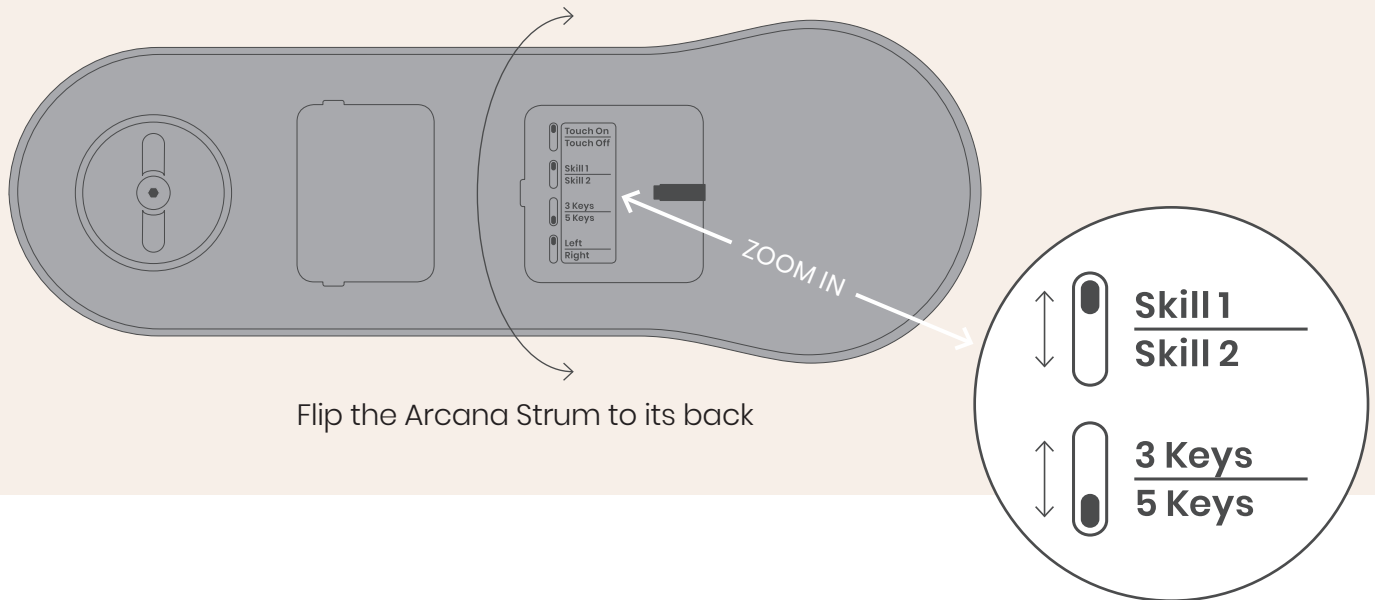
Chords, music accompaniment, harmony occurs when two or more notes are played at the same time.

* Melody -

Single notes, scales, a continuous tune as opposed to a harmony.

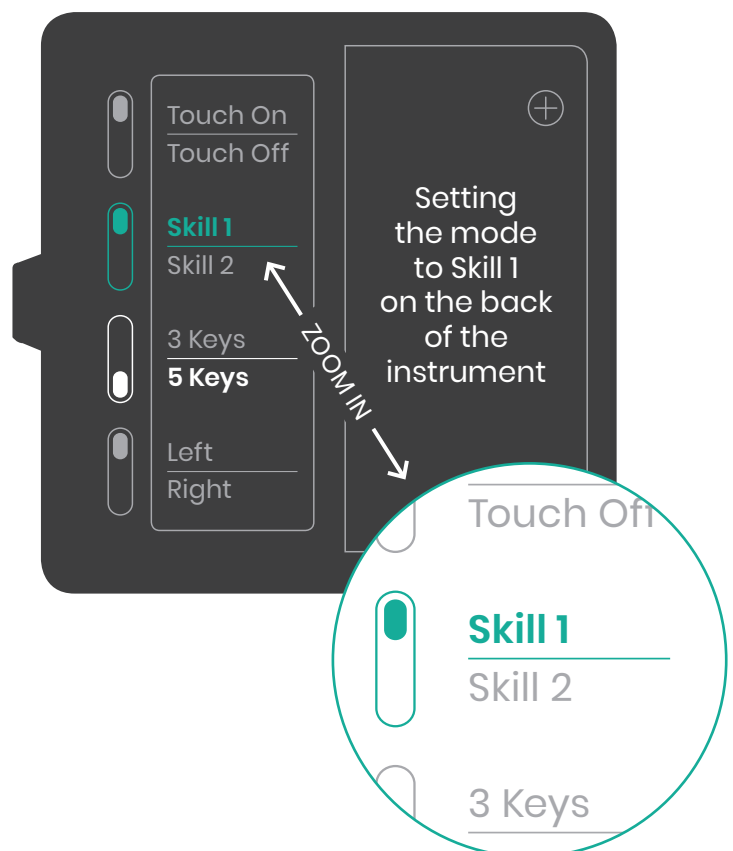


Skill 1

Jam Guitar

In this mode, the Arcana Strum is tailored for students who struggle with learning theoretical music on standard instruments, and allows them to progress in an accessible manner that prevents frustration. Despite its simpler method, this mode still provides a wide range of harmonies and melodies and allows a broad entry into the world of theory and performance in music.

It is highly recommended to use musical notation through colors (see example in the illustrations available further on).

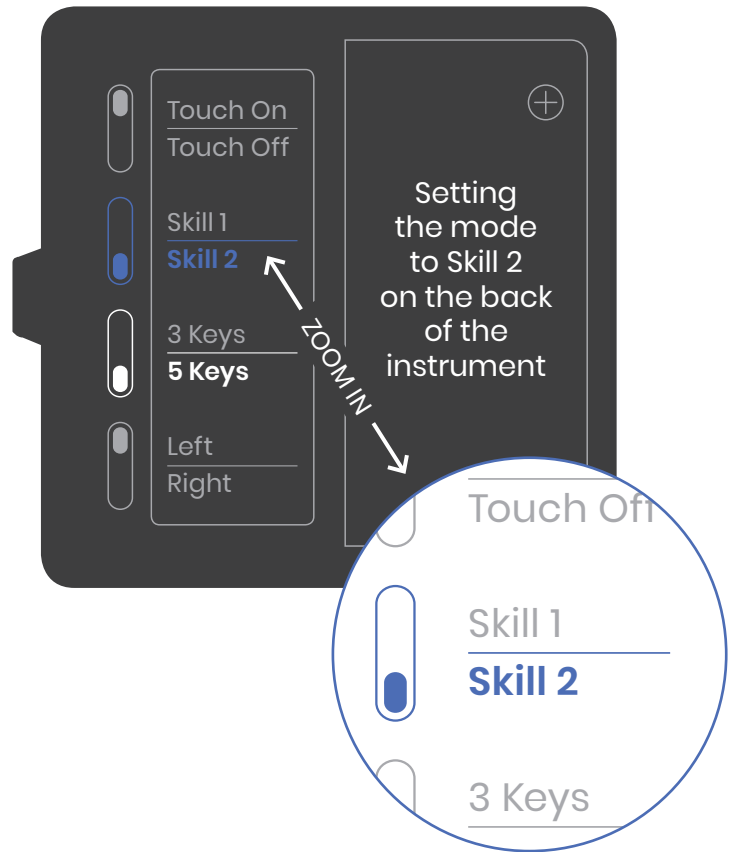


Skill 2

Chromatic Guitar

In this method, the musical theory is based on traditional instruments structured by halftone intervals, and a very wide range of notes and harmonies.

Skill 2 mode requires cognitive abilities that allow for memory, retention and the acquisition of the skills and language that are the same when learning how to play a standard guitar. It is very suitable for students who want to specialize in the field of music.

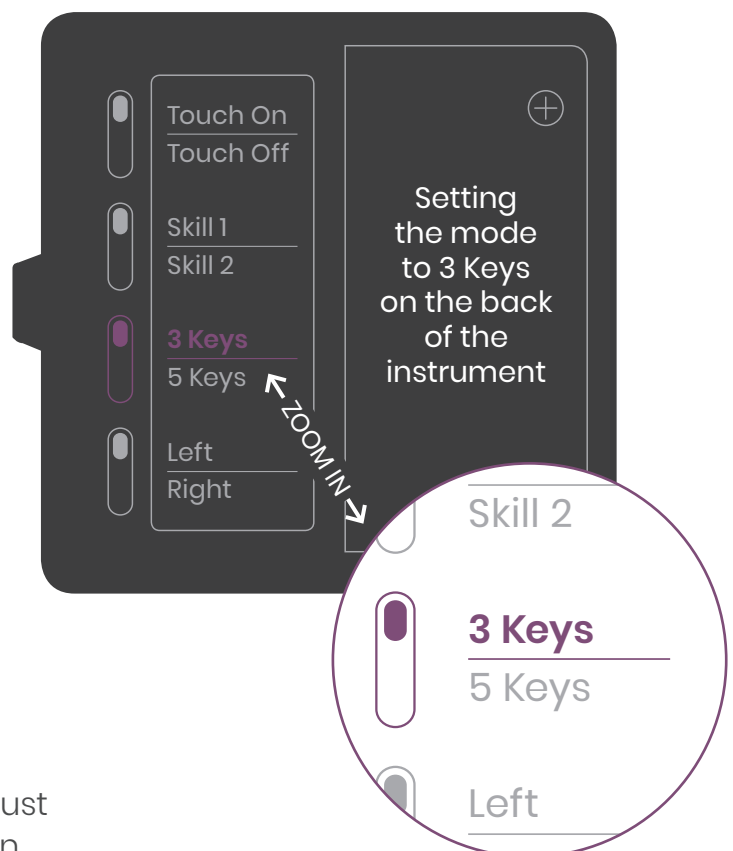


3 Keys

For students who are less suited to gain expertise using five keys

Using three keys is suitable in situations where movement is very limited - such as movement of the head or legs instead of arms, and the need for a larger surface area in cases where players can't use their fingers to press the keys. This mode is also suitable for cognitive limitations - such as problems in memory, attention and more.

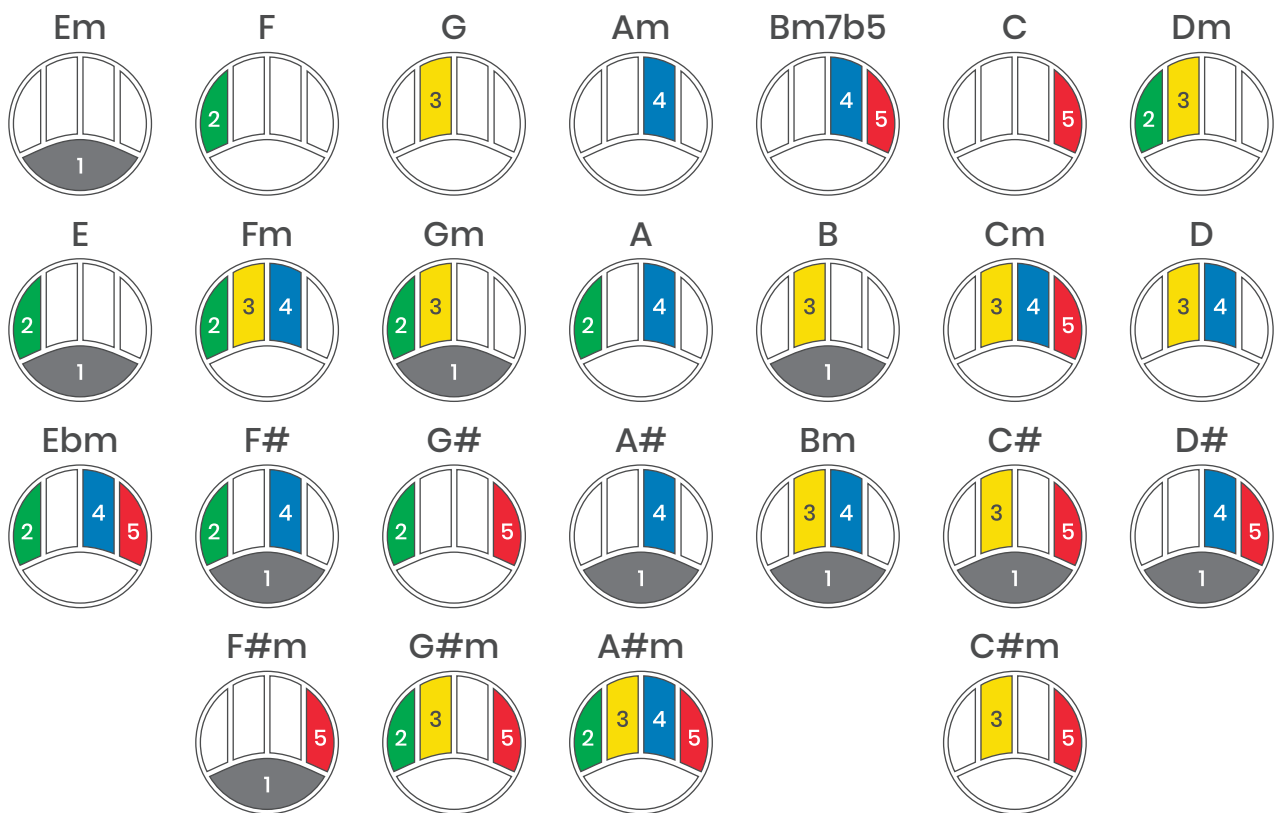
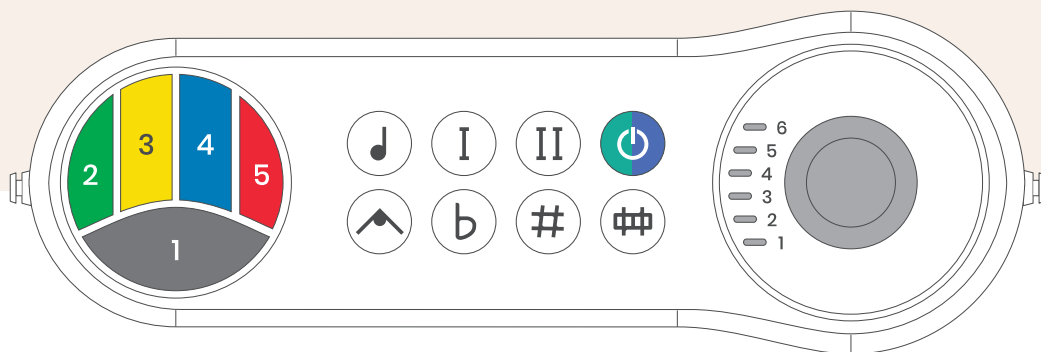
When this mode is activated, the keys must be replaced with the 3 keys configuration. This accessory can be bought separately. Although this mode is limited, it still allows for harmonic and melodic playing, and gives players a broad musical education.



Harmonic Guitar

Triad Chords

When the Arcana Strum is on, the instrument is in harmonic mode, and behaves like a standard guitar. Combinations of one or more keys characterise the six strings on the strumming handle, and are arranged as triad chords* in a range that is identical to a guitar.



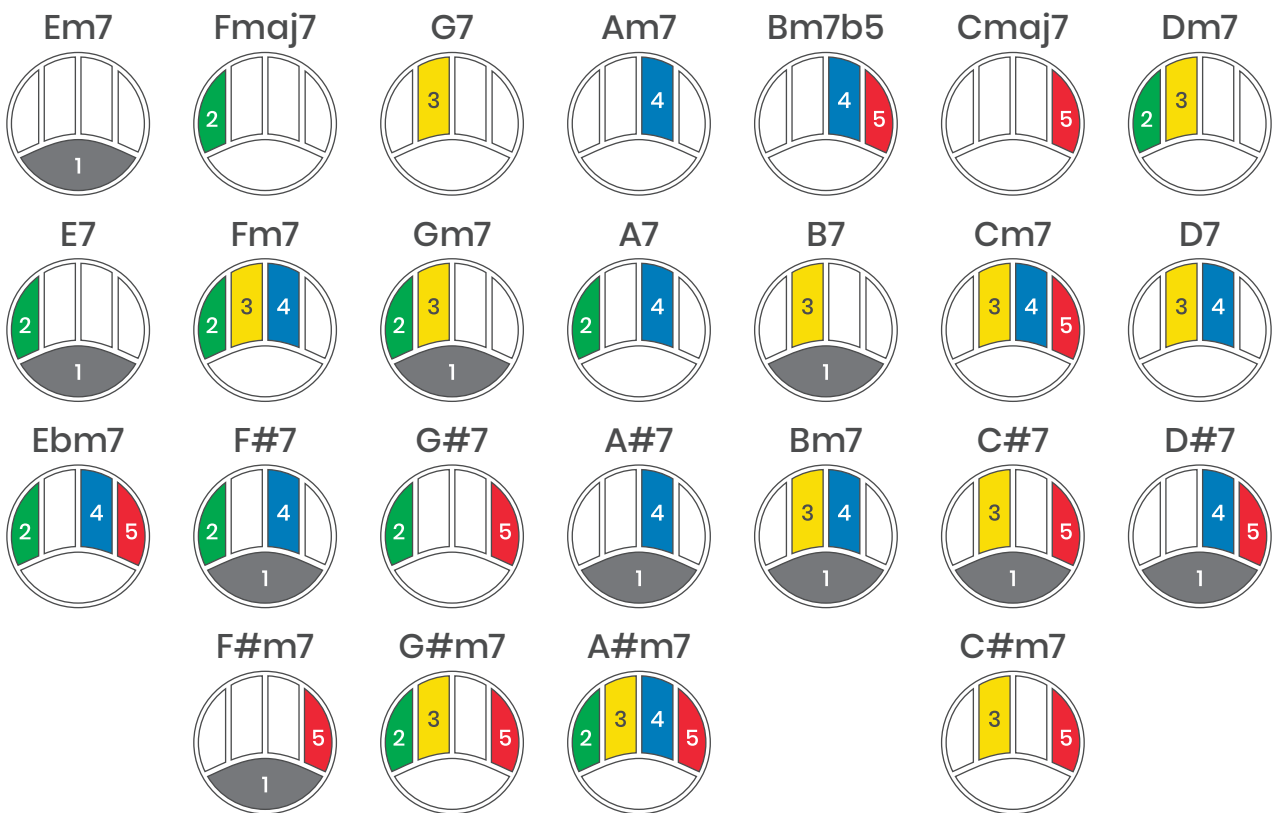
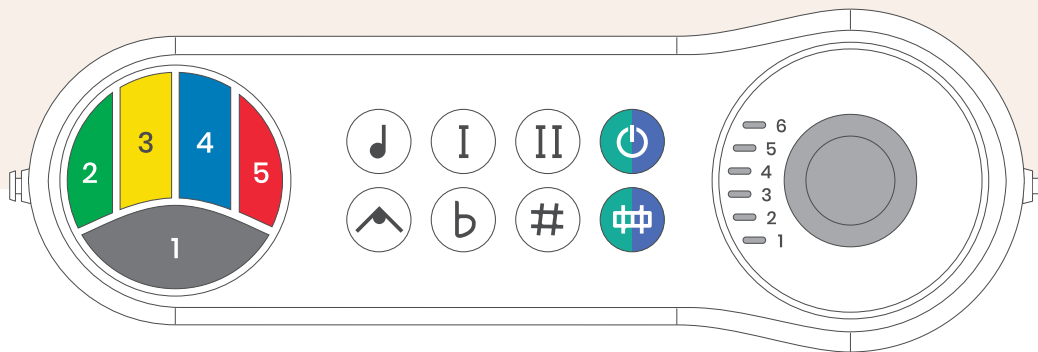
* **Chord** - a combination of three or more notes that are played together simultaneously or by breaking the notes of the chord down one by one.

* **Triad Chord** - a chord containing three different notes.

Septachords

Seventh Chords

When the Septachords button is activated, the notes order changes, and the chords change to chords containing four different notes. This mode allows users to play and accompany a large variety of genres such as blues and jazz.

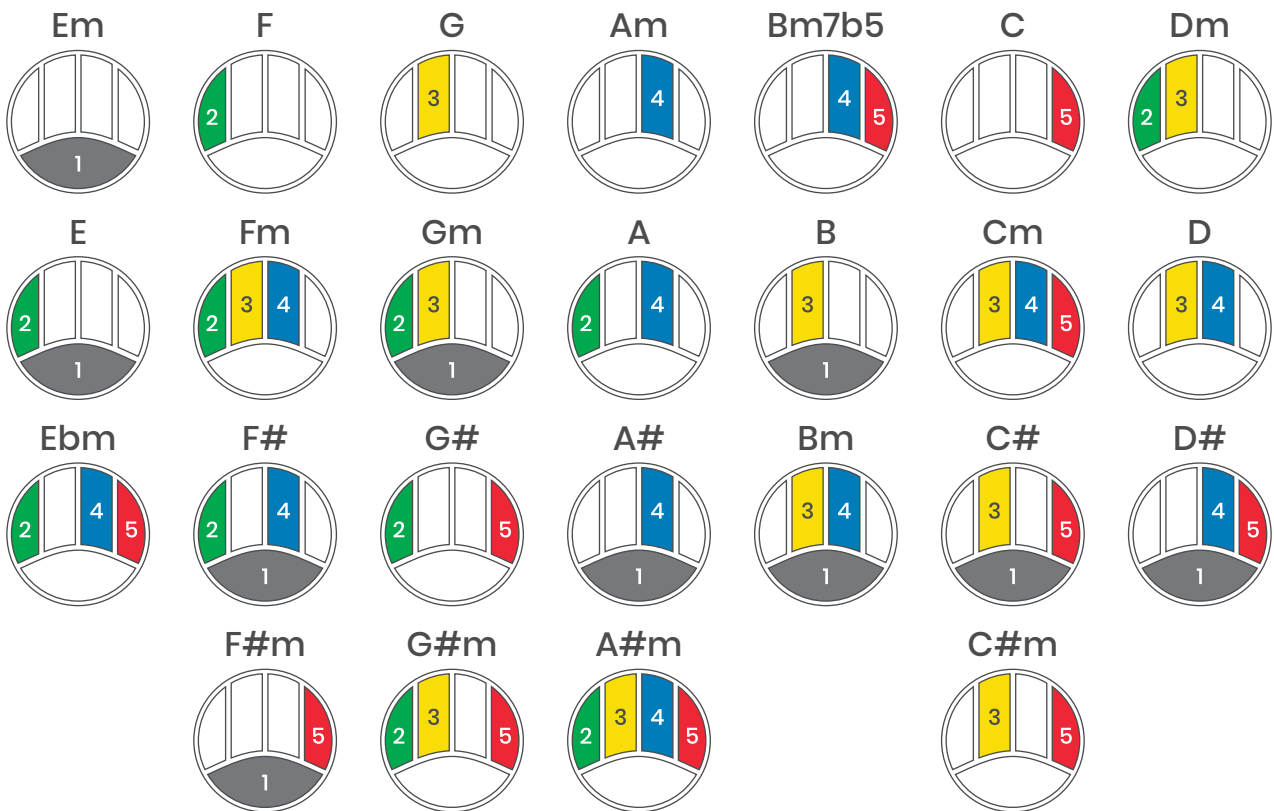
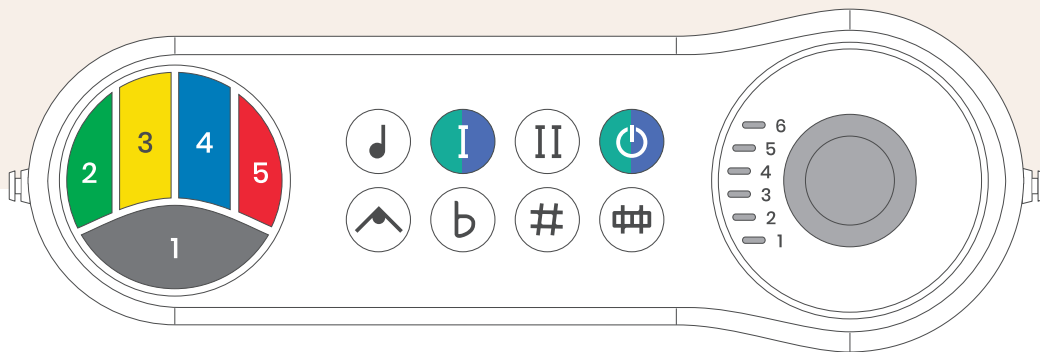

Arpeggio - the breakdown of chords

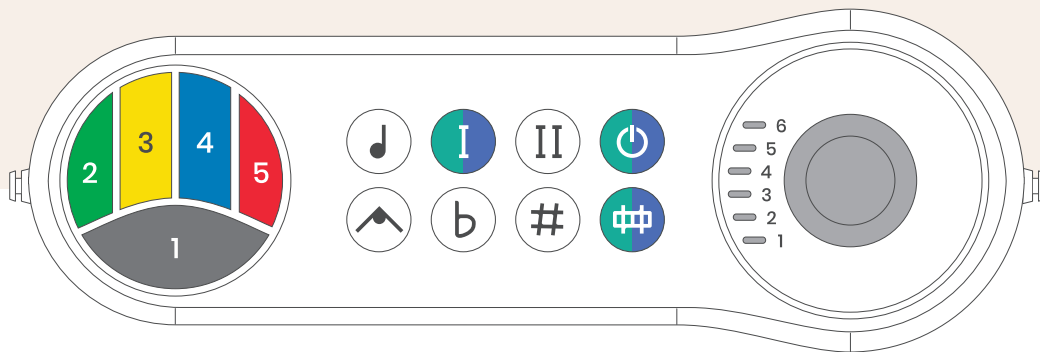
In this mode, the triad chords are arranged differently and allow for typical arpeggio playing on a guitar, without needing to skip over unwanted bass strings [explanation on the strumming manner and practice on page 10].



Continuous Bass

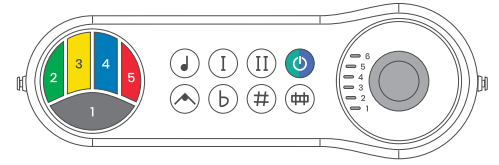
Chords with a constant bass and tension notes

In this mode, the chords change to chords that combine E as the bass note, and create chord combinations with tension notes that are very typical in world music (oriental music) and guitar accompaniment.

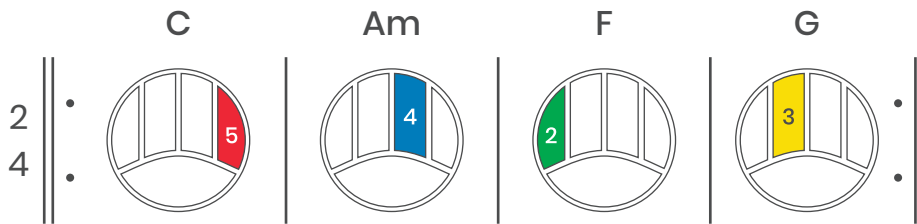

Interchangeable Bass and Suspended Chords

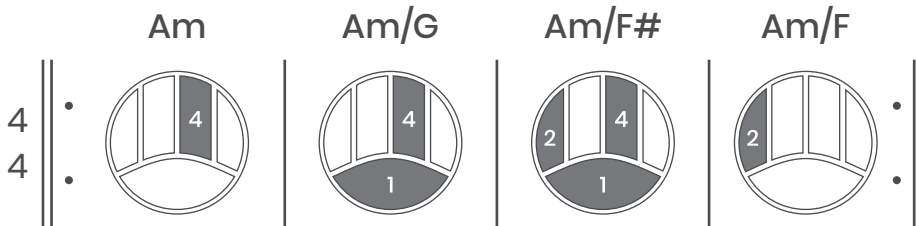
In this mode, the chords are changed to chords that have a changing bass note in the minor scale degree of Am, and to the chords E and D with changing tension notes.



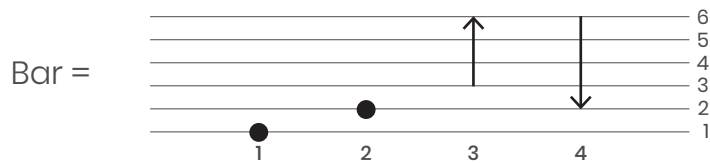

Diatonic Scale

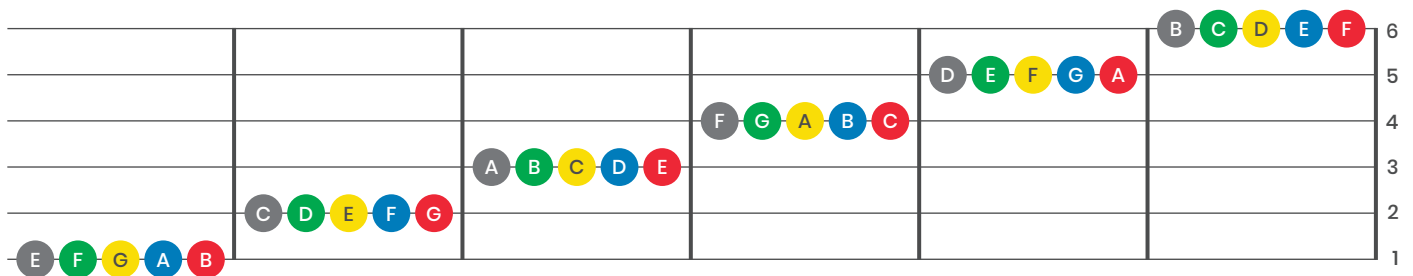
C Major and A Minor Scales

When the melody button is on, the arrangement of notes changes and is used for melodic playing. This mode allows one to play the C Major scale without accidental notes* (b and # notes) and provides a wide range of notes - 4 octaves.

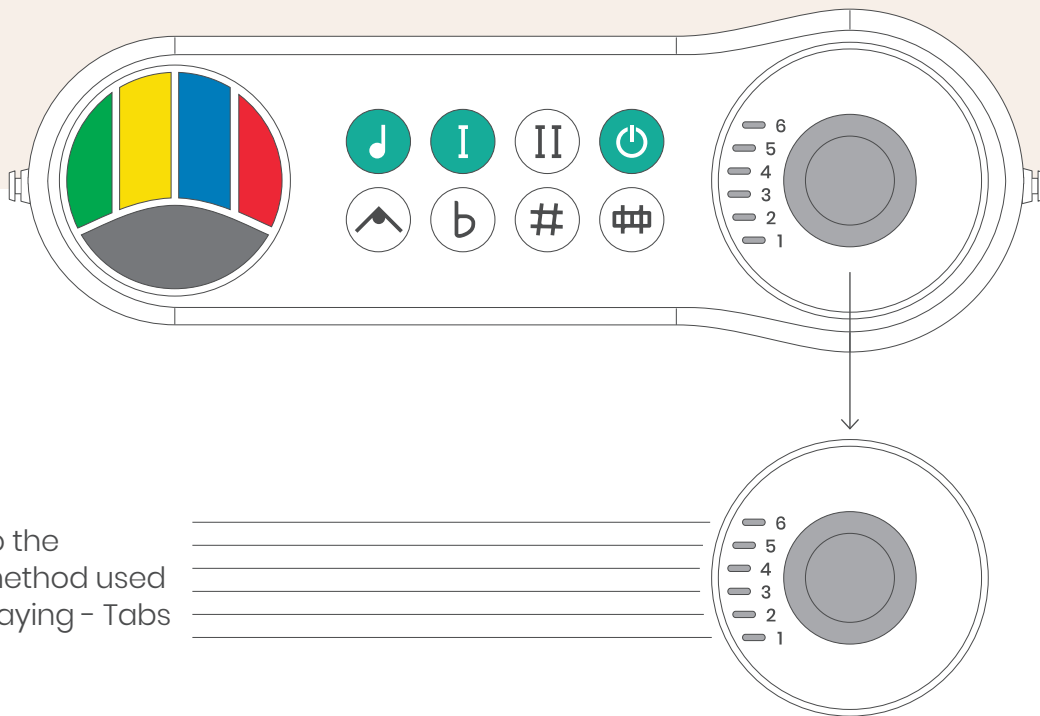


* **Accidental note** - an accidental modifies the pitch of musical notes in a written music notation, indicating the raising or lowering of a note by a semitone. # raises by a semitone. b lowers by a semitone.

* **Diatonic Playing** - playing without changing the scale. (In C Major, seven notes without accidentals # and b).

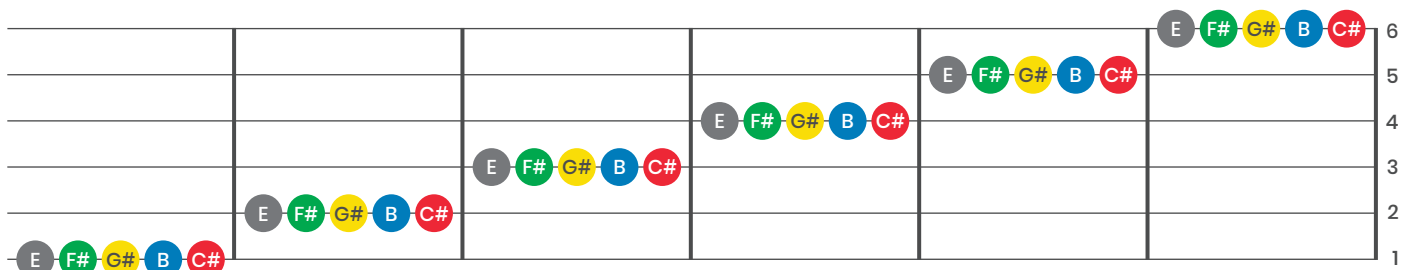
Pentatonic Major Scale I J

When the melody button and mode I are on, the arrangement of notes change similarly to the melody mode, but with a different note scale. This scale is a popular tool used in music therapy and musical education for young ages (3-8).

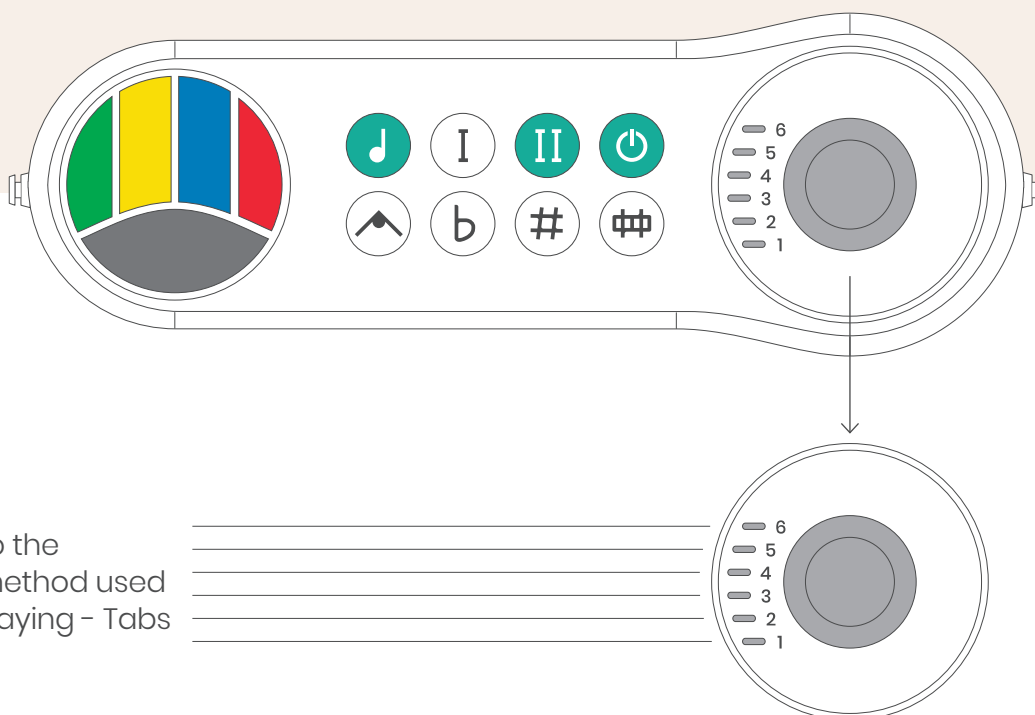

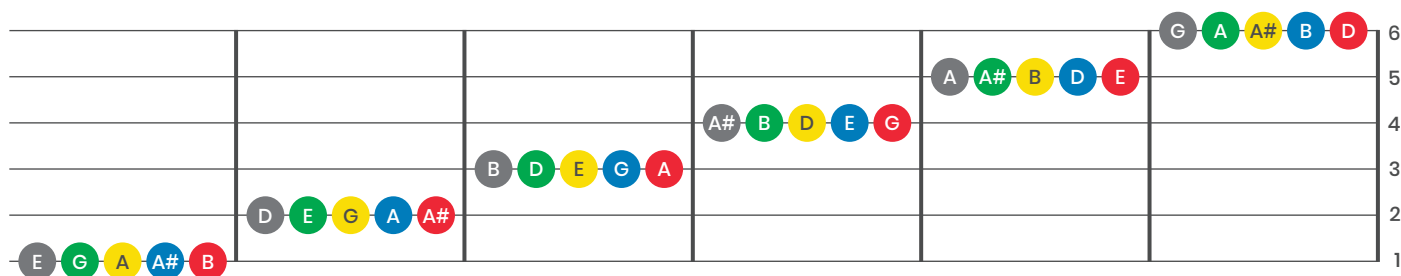
Blues Scale

When the melody button and mode II are on, the arrangement of notes change similarly to the melody mode, but with a different combination of notes. This mode allows users to play the blues scale - a scale containing six notes, which is very popular with Western and American music.



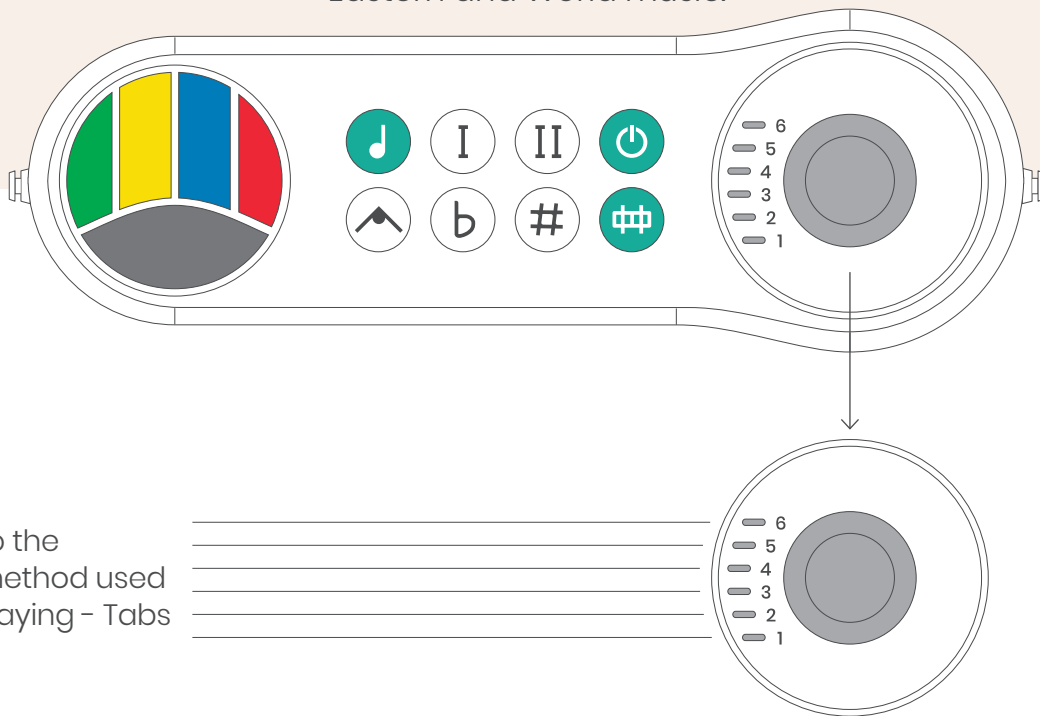

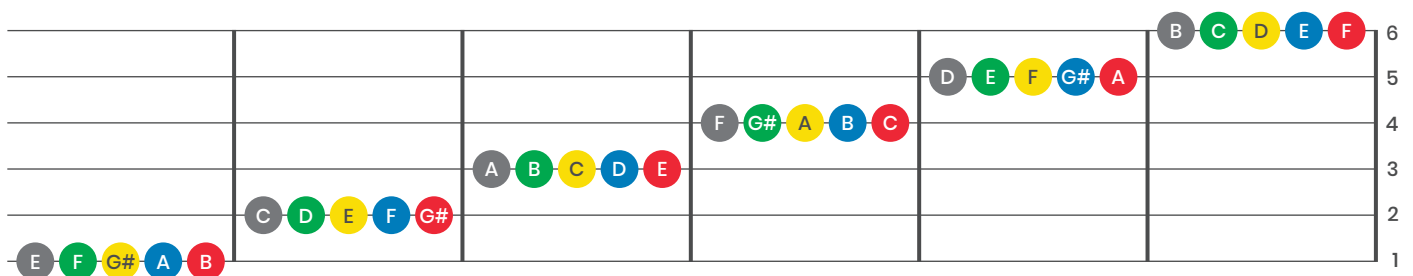


Hijaz Scale

When the melody button and the septa chord mode are on, the arrangement of notes change and G is raised by a semitone to G#. This creates the Hijaz scale - a unique scale characterized by an interval of a tone and a half. If we begin playing from the note A, we will be playing the Minor Harmonic scale, which is very popular in Eastern and World music.

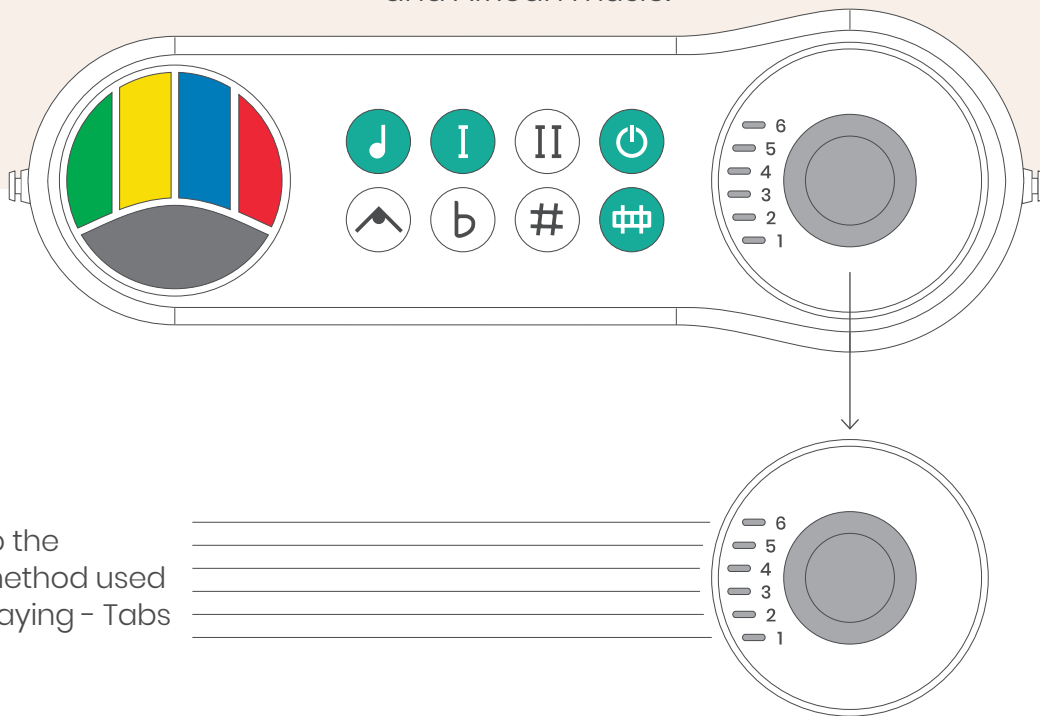

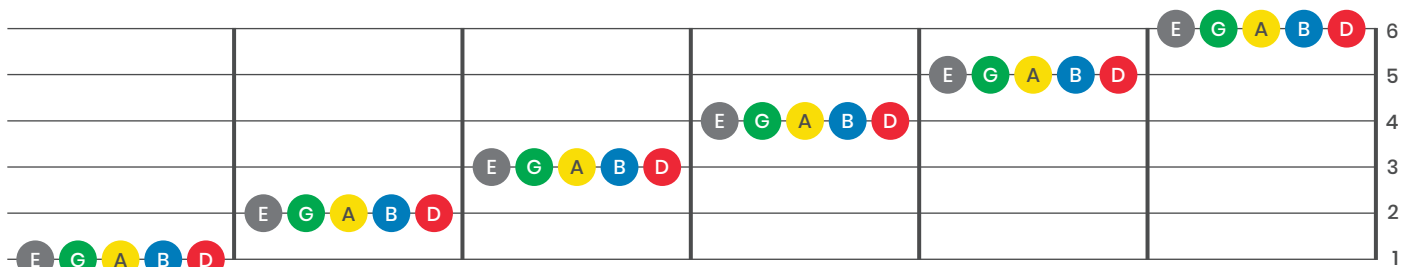
Minor Pentatonic Scale I ♯ ♪

When the melody, mode I and the septa chord mode are all on, the arrangement of notes changes similarly to the melody mode without the notes F and B. This mode allows users to play the Minor Pentatonic Scale - a very simple scale containing 5 notes. This scale is very popular in music therapy and characterizes the world of rock music and African music.

Chromatic Guitar E

“Open” Position

When the melody mode button is on, the arrangement of notes changes and is used for melodic playing. In this mode, the keys are arranged in a manner that is identical to the frets in a guitar, starting with a low, open E string, and allows users to play all scales in a range of two and a half octaves.



* **Chromatic** - a scale of notes structured by intervals of a semitone. It contains all western notes (12 notes).

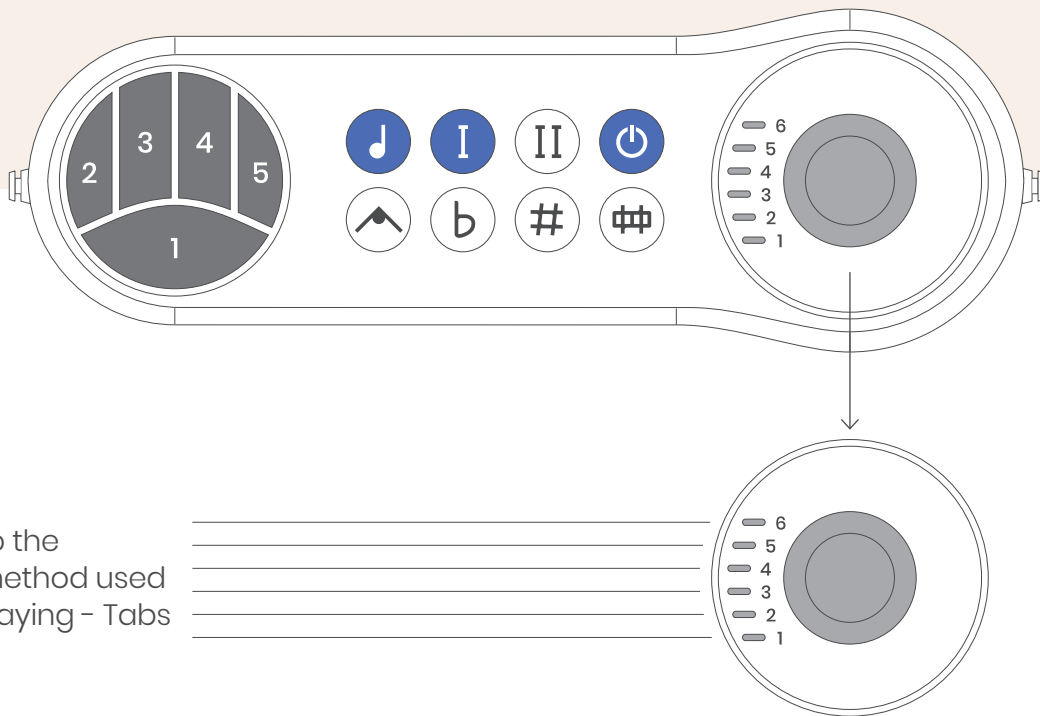


* **Octave** - the interval between one musical note and another with double its frequency. This interval is equivalent to six tones (or 12 semitones, 12 notes). For example - middle C up to high C.

“Minor” Position

When the melody button and mode I are on, the arrangement of notes changes similarly to the chromatic mode E, but with a higher range of notes same as that of a guitar from its 5th fret, and the tonic root note is A.

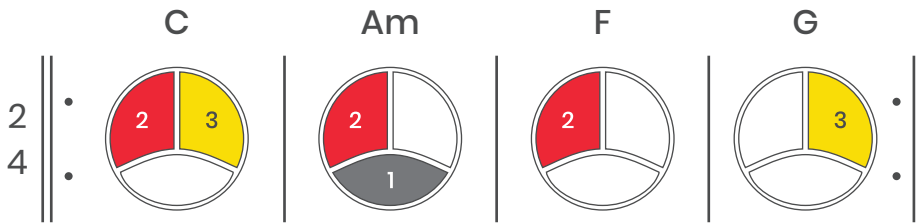
This mode is used to allow users to accompany minor pieces of music (A Minor) of which the fifth degree is a major chord (E Major).



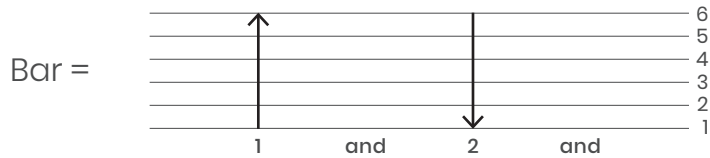

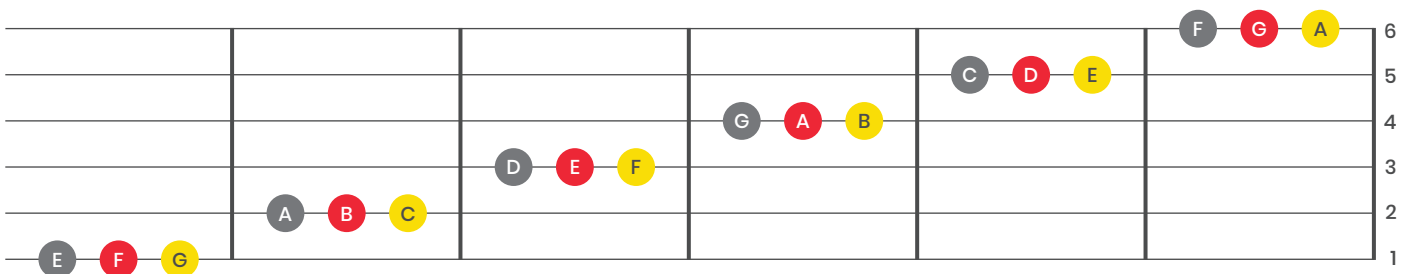
Diatonic Scale

C Major and A Minor Scales

When the melody mode button is on, the arrangement of notes changes and is used for melodic playing. This mode allows users to play the C Major scale without accidental notes (# and b) and provides a wide range of notes - 2.5 octaves.

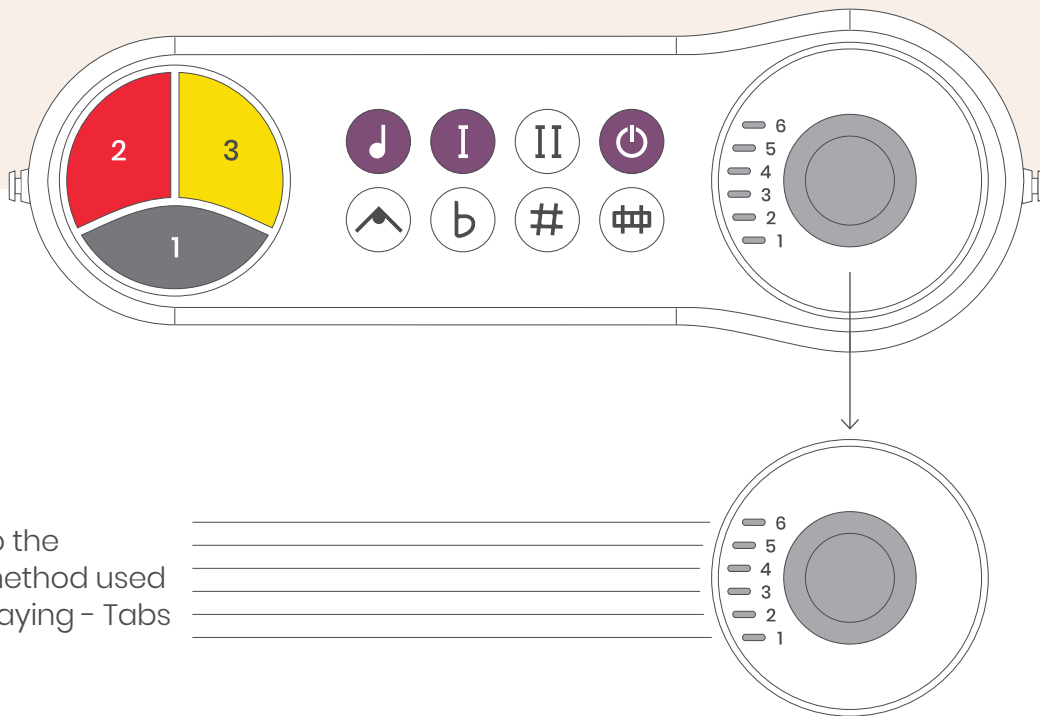

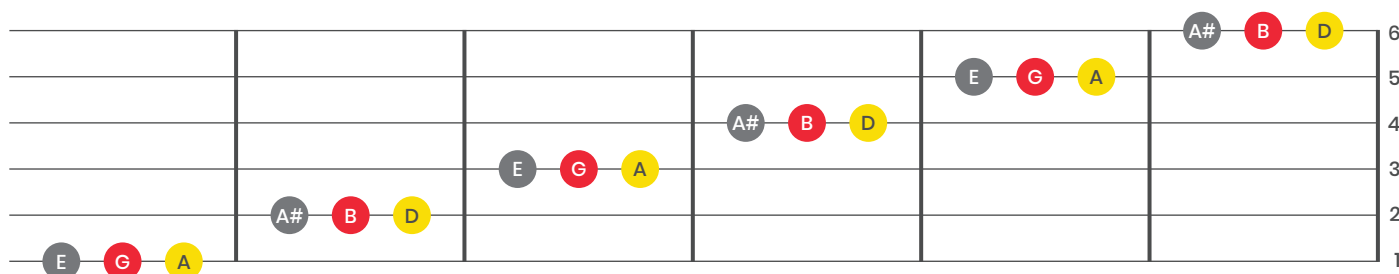


Blues Scale **II**

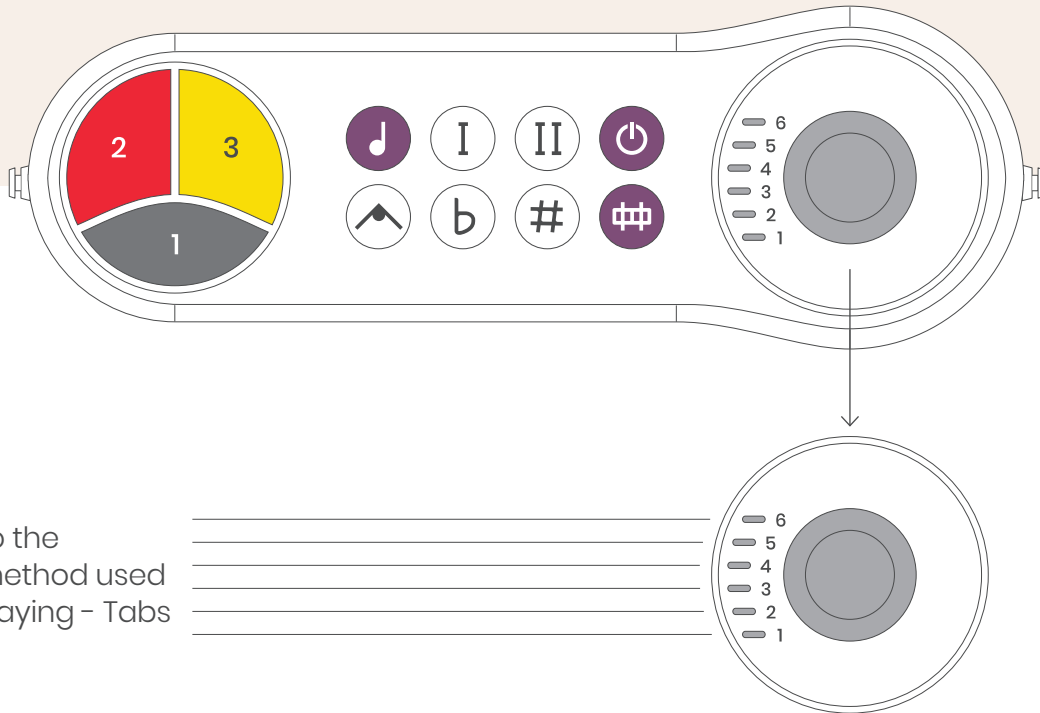

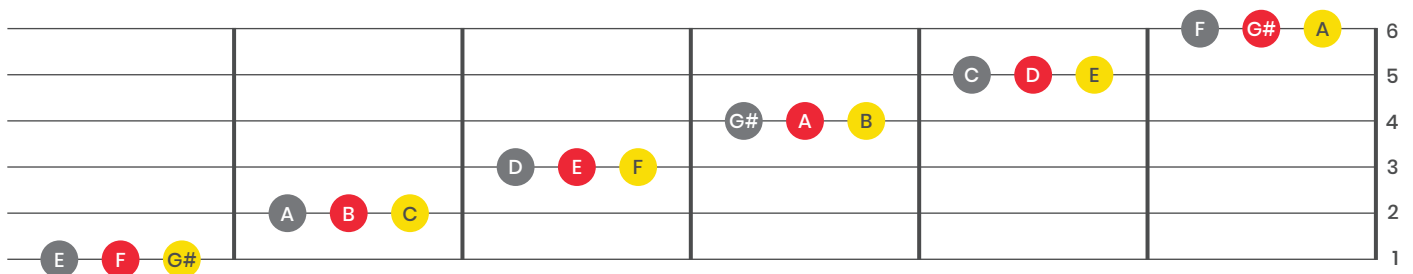


Hijaz Scale

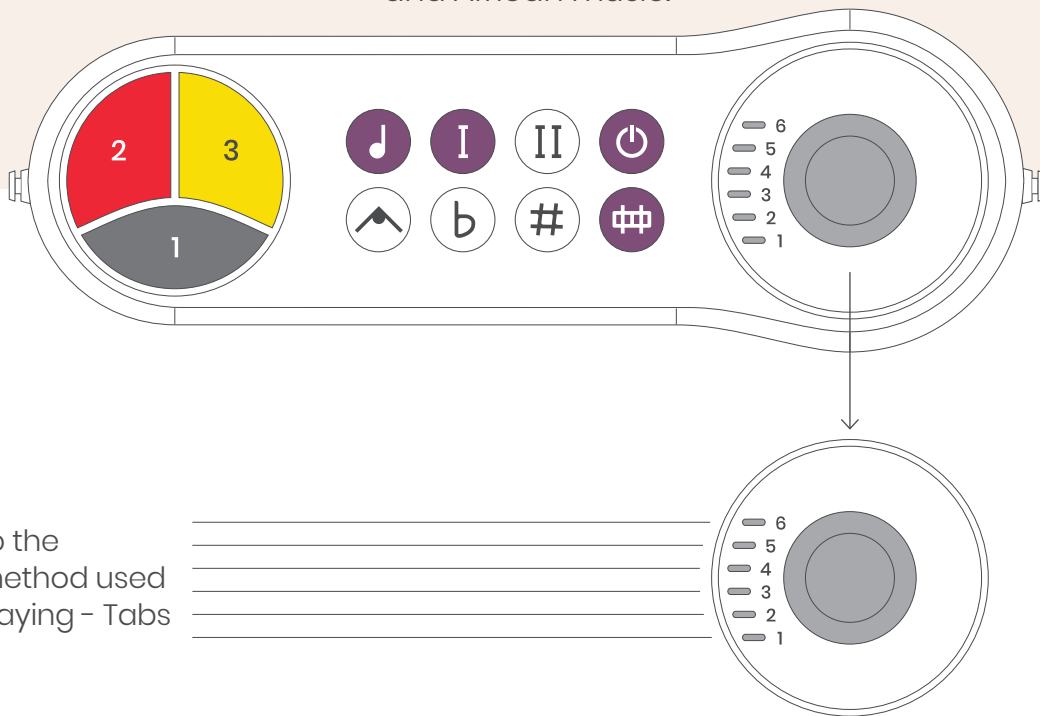

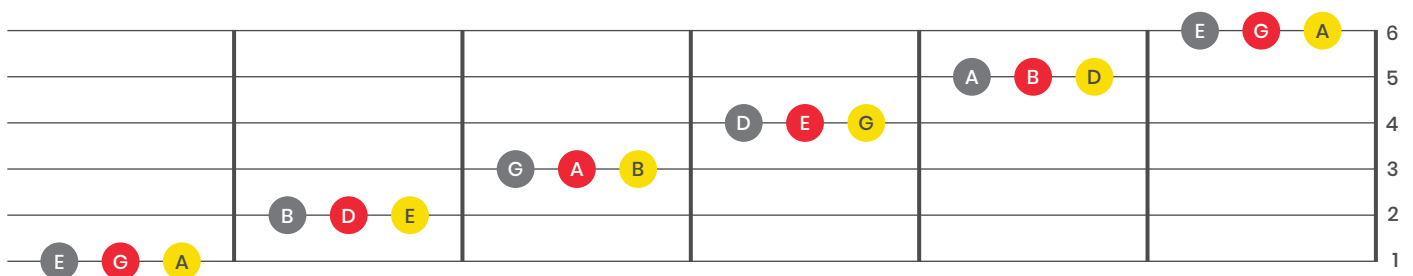
Minor Pentatonic Scale
